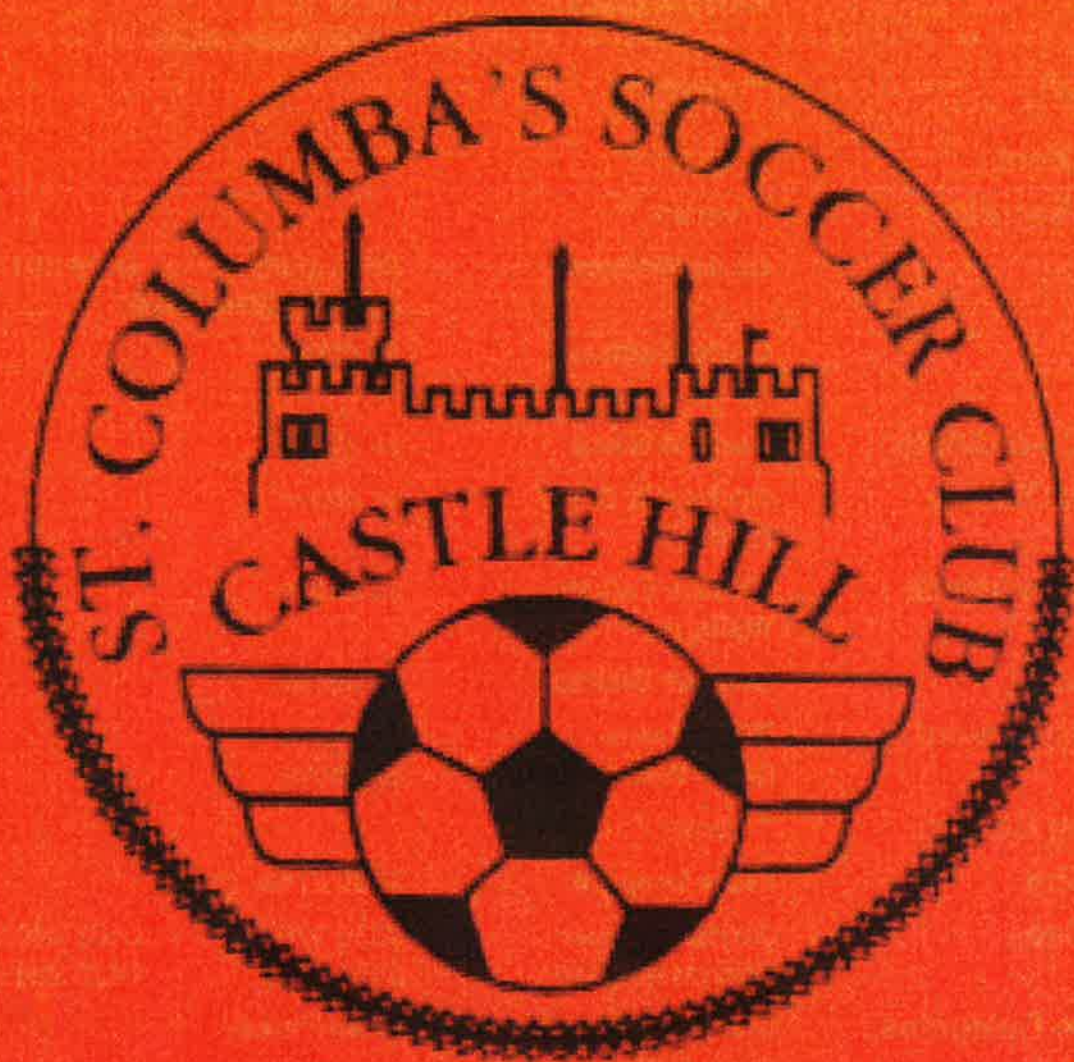

President's Report

Another year gone in which we can be pleased with the results from all our teams this season.

Firstly, our Premier League teams showed us how good they were by making the semi finals for the sixth year in succession. They also made the final of the State Cup Knockout Competition - after a great performance, they lost on corner kicks (in extra time) to a team that had only been defeated once during the entire season.

Our Raahauge Cup teams had a horror start to the season, losing the first five games in First Grade. It was not for a lack of effort, but with 20 new players coming into the two teams, it took a while to settle in. Once they started to win, they remained undefeated for their last six games, only to miss the finals by one point. A terrific job by coach Chris Wallace to get them fitter and keener as the season progressed.

The Under Sixteens were a very good side again this season, but unfortunately ran into a very fit St. Michael's team in the competition who just seemed to have the edge. The team was not helped by the weather – a washed out weekend cost them points. If they stay together, they will certainly make the basis of a good Raahauge Cup or Premier League side in the future.

Our Under Fourteens were consistent and would have finished much higher on the ladder if they had been able to score in the tight games. They drew a match and were beaten in a few others by a single goal. They will improve further under the guidance of Wilfred Riddles and Scott Jameson.

The Under Twelves (a combined Under 11/12 team) were marvelous, winning games, scoring goals and having their best season for three years. It was great to see them playing together as a team and congratulations must go to Martin Evans (coach) and Brian Johnson (manager) for their efforts.

The Under Eights had a mixed year, but moving up to the full field was a huge change and does take time to adjust. Jordan Moeser did a great job with them and during the year their positional play improved and their ability to get the ball back up-field quickly showed their maturity.

The Under Sixes were great to watch each Saturday. They enjoy themselves so much and provide great entertainment for all Mums, Dads and other spectators. Their improvement during the season was amazing. They scored a lot of goals, with Kaleb being the Club's highest goal scorer (with 26).

Our canteen was our major source of income again this year, followed by sponsorship from senior player Steve Sutherland of Macintype Design, as well as the Model Railway canteen.

We must thank Kerry Wallace for organizing the canteen and getting so many people to volunteer their time to work in the canteen and do the many jobs that need to be done before the games start.
