President's Report



Well the 2017 Winter season has well and truly come and gone for another year. 2017 has seen St Columbas retain its core nucleus of teams, but with a couple of distinct events this season highlighting the hopes for greater success both on and off the field as we already look forward to 2018. Personally I have seen a real mix of results and outcomes this season within St Columbas that could very easily see the 2017 season labelled the Good, the Bad and the Ugly.

The Good, is very simply the ongoing success of our under 15 team. From a core of players that have now played together at St Columbas for a number of years, the team made it to the Grand Final of their grade within the Granville Districts competition. While unfortunately the team went down in the Grand Final to a late extra time goal, this team continues to represent our club and our brand with a great deal of credibility and positivity, a reflection of both players, parents and team management. In conjunction with this success, our Senior ranks were replenished and refreshed this year, by a major influx of youth from within. The sterling efforts and encouragement from existing club members saw a number of new players come into our Senior team to breath some fresh air and enthusiasm into our Rahaague Cup squads. Given that the average age of these players would be somewhere close to 20 (about ½ the age of returning players) gives us a real sense of hope and development in the immediate future.

The Bad, well unfortunately that probably comes back to the Senior teams. While bolstered by the youthful injection of new players, the Senior squad still had a very tough season in struggling to score goals and achieve any level of success in both Reserves and First teams. On the other hand both teams were undeniably competitive during periods of the majority of games, and as manager, mentor, trainer, goalkeeper and part-time player Grant "Nathan Brown" Pullen would say, this was very much our "Newcastle" year.

The Ugly, for me is probably a reflection of the fact that this club continues to rely very heavily on the same management structure and support year on year across both our Junior and Senior teams. While no one on the Management Committee or our Managers/Coaches positions shirk their responsibilities this entails or the commitment required to make our club a positive environment for all to enjoy, another year has passed, we're all a year older and not a great deal has changed. However, we possibly look forward to a 2018 season and opportunities that may see some more "beauty" flourish within this club.

In other notables this year, our returning under 6 players from last year, came back with more than a few more friends and siblings in tow that saw us eventually field 2 under 7 teams for the majority of the season. With input from Ben Zunica and Rob Lansom, the under 7 "Black" team were highly successful throughout the season, and the under 7 "Orange" team developed into a competitive team unit by the end of the season.

The under 9 team under Alan also generated an influx of new players this year, that actually gave us some depth in numbers for games. This was a welcome occurrence given the lack of numbers the previous year. When all players were fit and able the under 9s were also a very competitive team with a capacity to trouble any team in the competition on their given day. But unfortunately a few too many "downs" outnumbered the "ups" and the team narrowly missed out on playing semi-finals this year.

I can confirm that our club is fortunate to remain financially stable. The ongoing income from our canteen and our one major fundraiser event, the Castle Hill Model Railway Exhibition support in late July, continues to provide the platform to enable us to support all our teams in whatever financial means are required. Once again I would like to thank all those that gave up their time and efforts over the Model Railway Exhibition weekend.

Special mention must go to Alan, and to a lesser extent Naomi, Kim and a range of support crew for their ongoing commitment to running our canteen each weekend at Excelsior. The income derived from their weekly efforts continues to be a benefit for the club and enables us to keep any costs passed to players to a minimum and reduces the need for excessive fundraising.

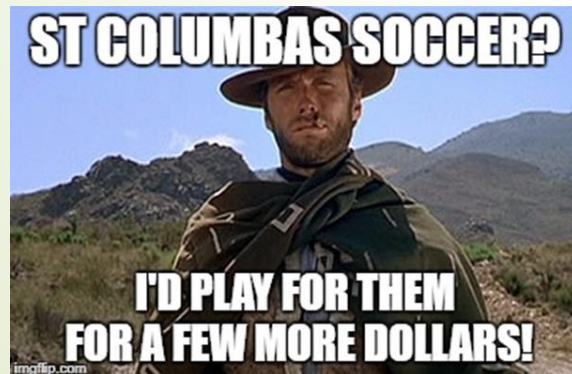
Once again I wish to thank my colleagues across the Management Committee for their ongoing engagement and involvement across our club this year.
