PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2019

2019 has been another year full of highlights and occasions to celebrate across the season both for our players' on-field and the general St Columbas past and present members off the field. This year was both the centenary celebration of the Sydney Churches Football association, and also the 50th anniversary of the establishment of St Columbas as a soccer club in the wider Hills area. This meant that there was ongoing commitments elsewhere through the course of the season, but the majority of focus remained on-field, with our current teams – 8 Junior teams, including 4 Academy teams and a new Girls team, and 3 Senior teams - competing in both Sydney CFA and Hills District competitions.

The Girls Under 9-11 team was part of a new Girls competition run by Sydney CFA, with the core of a combined team with Wentworthville Uniting coming from St Columbas. Theirs was the stand out overall performance of the year, going undefeated through the course of the season and decisively winning their Grand Final at Marconi Stadium against Guildford McCredie 3-0.

A number of the St Columbas girls were also selected in the Northern Zone representative team competing for the John Oliver trophy, and comfortably defeated their Southern Zone counterparts across 2 night games held at Phillips Park in July. We look forward to the growth and development of this competition for our girls next year.

In other team results, the under 12 Orange (Academy trained team) made it into the semi-finals this year, and both Senior Raahague Cup Orange teams (Firsts and Reserves) also made it into the semi-finals without going onto greater success. Unfortunately both Senior teams made it to the Major Semi-Final, one game away from a Grand Final appearance, but were knocked out in very tight and competitive finals games.

All 3 Senior teams were entered in the Raahague Cup competition this year, and all 3 teams showed ongoing promise of future success in a very competitive grade of CFA soccer. The Raahague Cup Black team played in the Reserves competition and managed to defeat the minor premiers, Kings Old Boys, twice during round robin play, but due to some other disappointing results and a lack of numbers for specific games eventually finished the season in 5th – 1 point outside semi-final contention. The biggest feature of this team was the ongoing injection of youth from our Under 17 squad, with a number of players showing the ability and willingness to step up and perform within the Mens CFA competition. When also considering the depth and quality of new players attracted to the Orange squad, we remain very positive and expectant of success within the Senior club in the coming years.

This year is marked with some sadness, with long term St Columbas stalwart – Life Member, Manager, Coach, and Management Committee member, Alan Spaul looking to retire from his involvement within the club to take on his full time duties as Sydney's no#1 grandfather! Words are unable to express the true appreciation to Alan for his long service and ongoing commitment to our club and the wider Churches Football Association fraternity, where he has held a number of state and national roles, but we wish him, Marie and family all the best for the future. We remind Alan that he will always be a welcome guest at any St Columbas game, event or celebration in the coming years.



As mentioned previously, 2019 was our 50th anniversary, and we were fortunate to have a club dinner and fitting celebration of such an occasion at Lily's Function Centre during the course of the season. A huge acknowledgement to our chief event organisers, Naomi and Kim, for their leadership in making our anniversary a real success for all involved in the evening. With help from some very well-known identities from past years within the club, there was a real sense of inclusion of all members past and present, that confirmed the sound foundation and genuine intent to enjoy soccer that I believe St Columbas truly represents. I can confirm that even Scott Moeser, our longest serving member of 43 years made a very fleeting appearance on the microphone on the night, much to the disappointment of his Under 17 squad who were hoping for some sort of Martin Luther King "I have a dream..." moment of inspiration for next season.

At this time I want to wish all the best for our players representing NSW City at the coming CFA Nationals in Brisbane at the end of the month, with Michael Glenfield in the Senior Mens team, Josh King and Ethan Sydenham both in the Under 18 Boys team and Liam Sydenham in the Under 14 Boys Team

As always I want to take the opportunity to thank my colleagues across the St Columbas Management Committee for their ongoing engagement across all areas of our club again this year. The core people keep turning up year after year with the same intent and endeavours to do whatever is required to make this club function. The resilience and capability within the Management Committee continues to hold us in good stead each year, and enables the majority of others to concentrate purely on the task of playing the game of soccer. Without their time and effort this would not be possible.

2019 has clearly been a successful year at our club. There has been some real success in what we have done and what we have achieved without actually necessarily winning a competition or noticeably expanding our club membership numbers. Everyone has been a part of this success.

Unfortunately I must acknowledge that Excelsior 2 was bereft of grass for the majority of the winter, a condition that is not common for what has been a relatively consistent quality of playing surface over the years. We can only hope that Hills Shire Council will address this in some manner through the off season, so that we can return to contemplate what the 2020 season will bring with some grass at our feet!

On behalf of the Management Committee I hope that you have all enjoyed your 2019 winter season, have a great summer, and looking forward to next year.
