PRESIDENTS REPORT

Well after hoping for a return to something closer to normalcy after our first COVID affected Winter season in 2020, the 2021 season was unfortunately truncated due to the ongoing management of the COVID risk within our society. In hindsight we were fortunate to be able to play as many rounds and progress through the season for as long as we did.

Overall, it can be said that the 2021 season was again a positive experience within the St Columbas ranks. We had the good news to start the season of re-entering a full Squad into the Churches Premier League competition. With clearly some solid recruitment and the retention of their ongoing player base, the Premier League teams had both the players and the attitude to be competitive. To this point the Reserve Grade were leading their grade when the season came to a premature end, and therefore on the cancellation of balance of the season were deservedly crowned Minor Premiers.

The club also fielded a full squad in the Raahague Cup division, with several returning Castle Hill Baptist players joining the St Columbas core to give the player numbers required to field 2 teams. While not quite living up to the burden of being returning Premiers in Reserve Grade, both teams had the capacity to be very competitive within this grade, but at times failed to live up to this expectation. There was an unfortunate frequency of injuries and unavailability, but to the credit of Scott and Kelvin the balance of the squad continued to front up in a positive fashion each week.

The Sydney Football Academy continued to have teams entered under the St Columbas banner in the Hills Districts competition. However, player numbers and hence team numbers were well down on previous years. With little engagement and commitment to involvement with the Management Committee, our ability to maintain a positive relationship with the Academy teams and structure was severely tested throughout the season.

St Columbas players continued their representation of the club under the Wenty Saints banner in the NSW Churches Girls competition in the U10 & U12 grades this year. These teams were fortunate to be supported by the coaching skills of 2 of our senior Raahague Cup players, Jacob Kaihea & myself for the duration of the season. The U10 team had a very successful run of results, whilst the U12s were a little more up & down with some significant challenges against their nemesis team at Guildford McCreadie.

As always, I wish to thank my colleagues across the Management Committee for their continued commitment and passion for our club and the sport of soccer in general. We continue to be given lessons each year on how to manage both our club and life in general in some unique circumstances.

It is hopeful that we can look forward to a far more settled and positive landscape for the 2022 season. However, the one thing that we must "learn" from the last 2 years is that nothing can be taken for granted, and therefore we look forward to the challenges and opportunities that the club may face in the coming 2022 season.
